

The NTL website at <http://ntl.bts.gov/> contains over 5,300 full-text documents.

The NTL has implemented a search engine that indexes 110,000 documents from 14 transportation agencies.

The NTL document collection includes U.S. DOT reports, transportation planning documents, and material from more than 30 state DOTs and university websites.

Over 1,000 organizations throughout the world refer their customers to the NTL website, which has over 10,000 visitors per month.
