TRIS FACTS

- ▶ The Transportation Research Information Services (TRIS) Database is the world's largest and most comprehensive bibliographic resource on transportation information. TRIS is produced and maintained by the Transportation Research Board (TRB) at the National Academies of Sciences.
- ▶ TRIS contains almost a half million records of published and ongoing research on all modes and disciplines in the field of transportation. Each year over 20,000 new records are added to TRIS.
- ▶ For almost 35 years, TRIS has been an important component of transportation information dissemination. It is used throughout the world by researchers, engineers, planners, economists, environmentalists, designers, consultants, lawyers, teachers, students, and others interested in the many areas of transportation.
- ▶ TRIS is sponsored by the Federal Highway Administration, the Federal Transit Administration, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, and the various state Departments of Transportation.
- ▶ TRIS will now be made available as TRIS Online over the Internet by the Bureau of Transportation Statistics of the U.S. Department of Transportation.



INTRODUCING TRIS ONLINE

TRIS Online is a vital component of the National Transportation Library, providing a record of the monographic, journal, technical report, and conference literature of the last half of the 20th century, and that of the new millennium. TRB will continue to produce and maintain the TRIS database and provide TRIS records to BTS under the terms of a Memorandum of Understanding signed in January 1999.

Question: How does TRIS Online differ from TRIS?

Answer: TRIS Online is the web-based version of TRIS and will provide full text, either directly or by links to full-text providers (publishers, document delivery services, etc.).

Question: Do I incur a cost to access TRIS Online?

Answer: Users will incur normal telecommunications and Internet Service Provider costs to access the World Wide Web. Document delivery services may apply.

Question: Does TRIS Online contain all the records I expect to find in TRIS?

Answer: Yes, with one exception—the international records derived from the International Transport Research Documentation (ITRD) system.

Question: How can I access the international records from ITRD?

Answer: TRIS Online will provide a link to the ITRD database (<http://www.fiz-karlsruhe.de/stn/Databases/itrd.html>). There will be a charge to access the database.

Question: What full-text documents will be provided?

Answer: Beginning in early 2000, links to full text will be established for a majority of the records in TRIS Online. Links may be to the publication in electronic format; to booksellers and trade association publications sales offices; or to journal article suppliers and other document delivery services that can provide current and retrospective publications under copyright guidelines.

NTL FACTS

- ▶ The NTL was established by Congress to improve the ability of the transportation community to share information. As directed by the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st century, the Bureau of Transportation Statistics is working with public and private organizations throughout the country to acquire transportation data in a variety of formats, ranging from databases and electronic media to maps, plans, reports, and other documents in the public domain.
- ▶ The NTL will organize, catalog, and make electronically available this collection to decisionmakers, planners, researchers, and the public.
- ▶ The NTL document collection contains over 5,500 full-text documents, including U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) reports, transportation planning documents, and material from more than 30 state DOTs and university websites. New documents are added daily.
