REPORT DISCREPANCIES IN AIDS TO NAVIGATION TO THE NEAREST COAST GUARD UNIT

I. SPECIAL NOTICES since LNM 20/97

PRIVATE AIDS

Owners of Private Aids to Navigation are reminded that they are responsible for the proper operation and maintenance of their private aids. When private aids to navigation discrepancy reports are received from the Coast Guard the owner should initiate immediate action to correct the discrepancy. Mariners have a responsibility to report discrepant private aids to navigation to the nearest Coast Guard unit. All aids to navigation on the Great Lakes, both private and federally maintained, are user monitored. The failure of a mariner to report a discrepant aid to navigation may result in casualties to others.. Upon notification of discrepancies the Coast Guard issues a broadcast notice to mariners which remains in effect until the discrepancy is corrected or listed in the Local Notice to Mariners. [21/97]

GENERAL NOTICE

Mariners are encouraged to report to their nearest Coast Guard unit any irregular or suspicious activity. Cooperation by the mariner will provide the public with important information fostering a safer boating community. [21/97]

LAKE ONTARIO - NY -Chaumont Bay, Abandoned Barge, Chart 14811

A 104 foot wooden barge with superstructure is aground approximately 50-75 feet from shore in Chaumont Bay, NY. This vessel sits in about six feet of water in position 44-1.6N, 076-16.8W. Although the majority of the barge is structurally sound, pieces of planking have fallen off one side of the vessel which is exposed to the elements . Mariners are advised to use CAUTION when operating in the Chaumont Bay area. [21/97]

LAKE ERIE - OH - Monroe Harbor, Test Buoy, Chart 14830

The Coast Guard has established a temporary test buoy in position 41-53-39N, 083-20-31W. This green can ice buoy has been established to test the zebra mussel resistant coating. [21/97]

LAKE HURON - MI-Pte. aux Barques - Chart 14863

A white buoy with red hazard diamond has been reported adrift in approximate position 44-08.85N, 082-52.49W, north of Pte. aux Barques. [21/97]

VI. PROPOSED CHANGES IN AIDS TO NAVIGATION since LNM 20/97

Periodically the Coast Guard evaluates the system of Aids to Navigation to determine whether the conditions for which the aids to navigation were established have changed. When changes occur, the feasibility of improving, relocating, replacing, or discontinuing the aid is considered. In this regard the Coast Guard is evaluating changes in aids to navigation as noted below. Comments are requested, and should be addressed to LTJG Henige, Ninth Coast Guard District (oan). All comments submitted should include the following information: (A) Quantity, type, capacity and value of vessels involved, and the extent that these vessels traverse the area under consideration seasonally, by day and by night, (B) Where practical, the type of navigation devices, such as compasses, radio direction finder, radar, LORAN and search lights with which such vessels are equipped, (C) The number of passengers and the type, quantity, and value of cargo involved, and (D) A chart section or sketch showing the action proposed when necessary to clearly describe the recommended improvement.

GREAT LAKES - PERMANENT REGULATIONS

Event(s) listed below is/are or will be published as a Permanent Special Local Regulation for the great lakes Annual Marine Events in 33 CFR Part 100. Mariners desiring to transit the regulated area may do so only with prior approval of the Coast Guard Patrol Commander for the event. The Patrol Commander may be contacted on VHF-FM channel 16 (156.8 MHz) by the call sign "Coast Guard Patrol Commander".

The following regulations apply to each annual marine event as published in 33 CFR 100.901:

- (1) The Coast Guard will patrol the regulated area under the direction of a designated Coast Guard Patrol Commander. The Patrol Commander may be contacted on Channel 16 (156.8 MHz) by the call sign "Coast Guard Patrol Commander". Vessels desiring to transit the regulated area may do so only with prior approval of the Patrol Commander and when so directed by that officer. Vessels will be operated at a no wake speed to reduce the wake to a minimum, and in a manner which will not endanger participants in the event or any other craft. The rules contained in the above two sentences shall not apply to participants in the event or vessels of the patrol operating in the performance of their assigned duties.
- (2) The Patrol Commander may direct the anchoring, mooring, or movement of any boat or vessel within the regulated area. A succession of sharp, short signals by whistle or horn from vessels patrolling the area under the direction of the U.S. Coast Guard Patrol Commander shall serve as a signal to stop. Vessels so signaled shall stop and shall comply with the orders of the Patrol Commander. Failure to do so may result in expulsion from the area, citation for failure to comply, or both.
- (3) The Patrol Commander may establish vessel size and speed limitations and operating conditions.
- (4) The Patrol Commander may restrict vessel operation within the regulated area to vessels having particular operating characteristics.
- (5) The patrol Commander may terminate the marine event or the operation of any vessel at any time it is deemed necessary for the protection of life and property.
